This rescued animal comes with no health, age, or temperament guarantees: AAEA will have presented the rescued dog to a veterinarian for a health examination. Results of said examination will be communicated to the adopter. Health history of the rescued dog may or may not be known, depending on how the dog came into rescue. Circumstances of the rescue also will be conveyed to the adopter, if known. AAEA will take no responsibility for the ongoing health of the dog once it has been adopted.

Age of the dog may or may not be known, depending on the circumstances of rescue and whether the dog was abandoned or voluntarily surrendered. A vet can give an opinion as to age, but that is what it is, an opinion. AAEA members will have evaluated the dog to the best of their ability as to temperament. Opinions will be shared with the adopter. Temperament will vary according to the situation, stress, and other factors NOT under the control or influence of AAEA club members. AAEA is NOT responsible for the dog's behavior once it has been adopted.

AAEA reserves the right to visit adopter(s) to check on the well being of the dog. Any evidence of animal abuse will result in the dog being removed from the premises.

Should the adoption not "work out" for any reason, the adopter must contact AAEA. We place with an eskie return agreement.
