This rescued animal comes with no health, age, or temperament guarantees: AAEA will have presented the rescued dog to a veterinarian for a health examination. Results of said examination will be communicated to the Foster Caregiver. Health history of the rescued dog may or may not be known, depending on how the dog came into rescue. Circumstances of the rescue also will be conveyed to the Foster Caregiver, if known. AAEA will be responsible for the ongoing health of the dog once it has been placed in a foster home, but the Foster Caregiver must contact an AAEA representative for approval prior to taking the fostered dog to the vet other than in an emergency situation.

Age of the dog may or may not be known, depending on the circumstances of rescue and whether the dog was abandoned or voluntarily surrendered. A vet can give an opinion as to age, but that is what it is, an opinion. AAEA members will have evaluated the dog to the best of their ability as to temperament and probable training based on "what they see". Opinions will be shared with the Foster Caregiver. Temperament will vary according to the situation, stress, and other factors NOT under the control or influence of AAEA club members. AAEA is NOT responsible for the dog's behavior.

AAEA reserves the right to visit the Foster Caregiver's home to check on the well being of the dog. Any evidence of animal mistreatment or neglect will result in the dog being removed from the premises.

Should the Foster Care arrangement not "work out" for any reason, the Foster Caregiver must contact AAEA for assistance. We place an Eskie in Foster Care with a return agreement.
